## Review

- A Humble Couple Luke 1:5-12
  - o What do you learn about Zacharias and Elizabeth in Luke 1:5-6?
    - How were people in the OT saved (Genesis 15:6, 6:8)?
    - Many of the Jews in Jesus' day became self-righteous, trusting in their works to save them (Luke 18:11-14, Romans 10:1-4). Have you ever believed your works could save your or do you know someone that feels that way? What verses can you point them to?
    - Why should Christians strive to live a pure and holy life? Does the Bible tell us to live holy?
  - o What struggle did Zacharias and Elizabeth face (Luke 1:7)?
    - Have you ever faced struggles in life that challenged your faith? How did you overcome those struggles?
  - o What excuses could Zacharias and Elizabeth given for not serving God?
    - Have you had to give up excuses in order to serve God?

# • A Heavenly Message – Luke 1:13-17

- o Gabriel's meeting was a divine appointment with Zacharias; their were an estimated 20,000 priests at this time in history, and most never got a chance to offer incense in that capacity. What is a divine appointment you have had in your life?
- o Gabriel knew Zacharias by his name; how does it make you feel knowing you are personally known by God?
  - How does that apply to Revelation 20:15?
- o How would you pray differently if every time you prayed God sent an angel that said, "thy prayer is heard"?
  - Do you think Zacharias and Elizabeth ever felt like giving up on praying for a child? How can you apply that to your life?
- o Why was the child great according to v. 15-17?
  - What are great characteristics about John that we can follow?

o Are you surprised at Zacharias' response? Do you think heaven is ever surprised by our response to His Word?
