Last Week Review – "John the Baptist" Text: Luke 5:1-11

- In Luke chapter five, Peter, James, and John are washing their nets after catching no fish all night. Jesus comes along that morning to the shores of the sea of Galilee and as crowds are pressing Him to hear Him speak. He gets into Peter's boat and from their He asks Peter to thrust out from the land so that He can teach the people. That morning Jesus interrupts Peter's life and gets into his boat.
 - o Why do you think Jesus chose Peter's boat?
 - When Jesus got into Peter's boat, it went from being used for "fishing" to being used to do what in verse 1-3?
 - o How can we apply this truth to our lives?
- Jesus gave Peter an opportunity to obey His Word by telling Peter to do what in verse 4?
 - o Is their a difference between "hearing" the Word and "applying" God's Word to our life?
 - o What do you learn from James 1:22?
- How did Peter feel about going back out and fishing in verse 5? Why was this a struggle for him?
 - o Do you think Jesus knew it would be a struggle for Peter?
 - o What in your life or past has been a struggle for you to obey? Why?
- What was the result of Peter's obedience in verse 6-9?
 - What in your life have you seen God do as a result of obeying God even when it was a struggle?
- What was the greatest blessing from the miracle of fishes that day (v.8-11)?

- What kind of friends did this guy have?
- Do you think you would have been willing to make this kind of sacrifice to bring a paralyzed man to Jesus? How far would you be willing to help carry someone?
