

The Gospel According to Luke

Last Week Review – Luke 6:27-36

- In verse 27 Jesus says, “*But I say unto you which hear...*”;
 - **Question:** Is it possible to be in the right place, with the right teaching, and the right teacher, and get absolutely nothing out of it? Why?
 - Has this ever happened to you? What caused the change from then to now?
 - Read the following verses and share what you learn from Jesus about the importance of hearing?
 - Luke 8:8, 8:15, 11:27-28; John 14:21
 - If Jesus put a premium on hearing the Word, what are practical things you can do to practice better hearing?
 - What kind of attitude do we need to have toward our enemies according to verse 27?
 - What are actions you can do that manifest a loving attitude toward your enemies according to verse 27-31?
- Who does Jesus say we need to seek to be like in verse 36?
- In your life do you find yourself following these commands?

Today’s Sermon Text: Luke 6:37-42

- Have you ever had someone quote Luke 6:37 (or Matthew 7:1) to you?
- Why do people like to quote this verse?
- Are Christians ever suppose to judge anyone for anything?
- Why should Christians be known for forgiveness rather than being judgmental and condemning?
- What great truth does Jesus teach in verse 38? How have you seen this true in your life?
- What do you think Jesus means in verse 39 that the blind cannot lead the blind?
 - Who does Jesus call blind in the following passages?
 - **Matthew 15:12-14 — 12;** *Then came his disciples, and said unto him, Knowest thou that the Pharisees were offended, after they heard this saying? 13; But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up. 14; Let them*

alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch.

- **Matthew 23:14–16 — 14;** *Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayer: therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation. 15;* *Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye compass sea and land to make one proselyte, and when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child of hell than yourselves. 16;* *Woe unto you, ye blind guides, which say, Whosoever shall swear by the temple, it is nothing; but whosoever shall swear by the gold of the temple, he is a debtor!*

- In verse 40 Jesus said that the disciple will be like his master or teacher; how important is it to have the right teachers in your life if you will become like them?
- What important truth do you learn in verses 41-42? How can you apply these verses to your life?
